There <b>is</b> a bus.	He can speak Spanish.
There <b>are</b> people.	You can open the door.
It <b>is</b> a park.	
You <b>are</b> happy.	
Negative sentences	Negative sentences
There <b>isn't</b> a bus.	He can't (=cannot) speak Spanish.
There <b>aren't</b> any people.	You <b>can't</b> open the door.
It <b>isn't</b> a park.	
You aren't happy.
